## **CV Félix Gutiérrez**

Félix Gutiérrez, MD, is Head of Internal Medicine at Hospital General Universitario de Elche (HGUE) and Professor of Infectious Diseases at University Miguel Hernández (UMH) of Alicante, where he is also Director of the Department of Clinical Medicine.

Dr. Gutiérrez received his medical degree from University of Salamanca and subsequent M.Sc at the Royal Postgraduate Medical School at London University and Ph.D at the University of Madrid. He served his residency in Internal Medicine at Hospital 12 de Octubre of Madrid, while continuing his fellowship in Infectious Diseases at Hammersmith Hospital in London. He promoted the creation of the Infectious Diseases Unit at HGUE in 1997, which he directed until 2015. Currently chairs the Institutional Professorship of Infectious Diseases and HIV/AIDS of UMH.

He is actively involved in research, clinical practice, and teaching. His ongoing areas of research include non-AIDS diseases in patients with HIV, antiretroviral therapy and SARS CoV-2/COVID-19. He has led or participated in more than 30 research projects and 40 original studies of antiretroviral therapies. He has more than 450 publications in peer-reviewed journals and participated as editor, reviewer and/or coordinator in more than 25 expert panels of clinical practice guidelines. He has been guest speaker in more than 200 occasions in scientific meetings. As chair of the Postgraduate Teaching Program at HGUE and Director of the Master in Infectious Diseases & Global Health he oversees the training and research projects of many postgraduate students.
